Requires minimum of 60 hours:

- Education courses, These courses begin with the prefixes: EDF, EDP, EEX, EME or MAE
- Any course that is less than 3 credit hours
- Remedial Courses
- Physical Education Courses
- Private lesson courses (such as music courses)

Books are provided for PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS ONLY. State Statute requires private and home school students to purchase their own text books.

Volusia county public school students can obtain a book voucher in the advising office at any campus to purchase their books. **BOOKS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE BOOKSTORE, UNDAMAGED, NO LATER THAN ONE WEEK AFTER THE CLASS ENDS.** If the book is damaged or if the student does not return the book on time they will be responsible to pay for the full cost of the book. Payment can be made at the Student Accounts Office at Daytona State College. If the student does not return the book or the book is damaged a hold will be placed on the student's record preventing registration and release of transcripts until payment is made.

Flagler county public school students will receive their books at their high school and will be required to return the books at the end of the semester.
