



Daytona State College and Head Swimming & Diving Coach Don Gibb are pleased to announce the hiring of **Caitlin Iversen** as their new Assistant Swimming & Diving Coach and Coordinator of the Developmental Swimming Team for the Falcons. Iversen hails from Centennial, Colorado, where she was an All American and High School State Champion at Cherry Creek H.S. four years in a row. She also had a storied collegiate career as a member of the University of Arizona's Women's Swimming & Diving squad where the Wildcats captured both Pac-10 and NCAA team titles. She ranked in the Top Ten All Time for Arizona in several events (1:53.66 200 Backstroke, 1:58.29 200 IM, 4:10.64 400 IM) and participated in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials finishing ninth in the 200 meter backstroke (2:11.86).

According to Gibb, "Caitlin's enthusiasm and success as a student-athlete will be a tremendous asset to Daytona State College, our swimmers, and our local community. Having had the opportunity to be trained by some of the most admired and respected coaches in our sport at The University of Arizona, she will make an immediate impact on our team by implementing the most innovative and proven methods available today.
