Volusia County

- * Overall population *growth* of 10.4% 51,250 people in last decade from 443,343 in 2000 to the current 494,593. Table 1 & Graph 1
- * Deltona 85,182 is the *most populous* in the county followed by Daytona Beach and Port Orange respectively. Table 1
- * In the last *decade population shifts* in Volusia County has been from north region -3,573 to the south region +45,059. Table 2
- * The *southwest region* of the county has experienced the most population growth with an increase of 29,403. Table 2
- * Six cities show a *decrease in population* in the last decade including Daytona Beach, South Daytona, Pierson, , Holly Hill, Lake Helen and Daytona Beach Shores. Table 2
- * Ten cities show an *increase in population* in the last decade including Deltona, Port Orange, unincorporated county areas, DeLand, Orange City, DeBary, New Smyrna Beach, Edgewater, Ormond Beach, Ponce Inlet and Oak Hill. Table 2
- * Ormond Beach is the only city in the *northeast region* to experience growth of 1,836 (4.8%) in the last decade from 36,137 in 2000 to 38,137 in 2010. Table 2
- * In the northern region of the county it appears the White race is soon to be the minority. Two cities show demographics shifts with the White race at 57% in both Daytona Beach and Pierson. Table 3
- * The *Hispanic population* is the 2nd largest demographic in Volusia County (55,217). Table 5
- * The *Black population* is the 3rd largest demographic in Volusia County (51,791). Table 5
- * Four cities (Ponce Inlet, Daytona Beach Shores, Edgewater and Port Orange) in the county show *very little diversity* with over 90% of the population majority are of White race. Table 4
- * The majority of the Asian population is located in Daytona Beach 18.2%, Port Orange 16.7%, Deltona 14.2% and Ormond Beach 11.4%. Table 5
- * Almost half 41.7% of the *Black population* in Volusia County (51,791) is located Daytona Beach. Table 5
- * Almost half 46.6% of the *Hispanic population* in Volusia County (55,217) is located Deltona. Table 5
- * Almost one out of every five homes in Volusia County are vacant (45,990), 18.1% county vacancy rate. Table 8
- * Six cities show an occupancy rate higher than the overall county rate including Daytona Beach Shores 59.3%, Ponce Inlet 47.4%, New Smyrna Beach 34.3%, Oak Hill 23.7%, Holly Hill 21.2% and Daytona Beach 19.5%. Graph 2

Flagler County

- * Overall population *growth* of 47.9% 45,864 people in last decade from 49,832 in 2000 to the current 95,696. Table 1
- * Palm Coast 75,180 is the *most populous* in the county. Table 1
- * Both cities of Beverly and Flagler Beach show a *decrease in population* in the last decade. Table 1
- * In the city of Bunnell the White race is soon to be the minority representing 59.9% of the population, while Blacks 31.7%. Table 3
- * The *Black population* is the 2nd largest demographic in Flagler County (10,884). Table 5
- * Almost one out of every five homes in Flagler County are vacant (9,409), 19.4% county vacancy rate. Table 8

Daytona Beach

- * Population decreased by -3,107 (-5.1%) in the last decade from 64,112 in 2000 to 61,005 for 2010. Table 1
- * Blacks represent 35.4% (21,585) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * Whites represent 57.8% (35,265) of the city population, soon to be the minority race. Tables 3 & 4
- * Holds majority 41.7% of the Black population in Volusia County (51,791). Table 5
- * City makes up 12.3% of the Volusia County Population ranking 2nd. Table 5
- * Ranks 1st in the county with the largest number 1,374 and percentage 18.2% of the Asian population. Table 3 & 5
- * The Hispanic population increased by 1,523 (40.6%) in the last decade from 2,232 in 2000 to 3,755 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * The largest population decrease in the city was in the White race down by -4,698 in the last decade. Table 7
- * Almost one out of every five homes in the city are vacant (6,606), 19.5% county vacancy rate. Table 8

Daytona Beach Shores

- * Population decreased by -57 (-1.3%) in the last decade from 4,299 in 2000 to 4,242 for 2010. Table 1
- * Only 35 Blacks live in the city representing .8% of the population. Table 3 & 4
- * A small community with a predominantly White 94.5% population. Table 4
- * Three out of every five homes in the city are vacant (3,535), 59.3% county vacancy rate. Table 8

DeBary

- * Population increased by 3,761 (19.5%) in the last decade from 15,559 in 2000 to 19,320 for 2010. Table 1
- * A city with a predominantly White 90.5% population. Table 4
- * The Hispanic population increased by 1,111 (63.3%) in the last decade from 645 in 2000 to 1,756 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * The Black population increased by 769 (61.5%) in the last decade from 296 in 2000 to 769 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * The White population increased by 2,712 (15.5%) in the last decade from 14,772 in 2000 to 17,484 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * One out of every ten homes in the city are vacant (913), 10.2% county vacancy rate. Table 8
- * Has the lowest housing vacancy rate in the southwest region of Volusia County. Table 8

DeLand

- * Population increased by 6,127 (22.7%) in the last decade from 20,904 in 2000 to 27,031 for 2010. Table 1
- * Showed the largest population percentage increase (22.7%) for the *southwest region* of the county. Table 2
- * Whites represent 74.5% (20,142) of the city population. Table 3 & 4
- * Blacks represent 17.1% (4,610) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * The Hispanic population almost doubled in the last decade with an increased of 1,598 (46.7%) from 1,824 in 2000 to 3,422 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * City has a 14.8% (1,864) vacancy rate. Table 8

Deltona

- * The *most populous* 85,182 city in Volusia County. Table 1
- * Population increased by 15,639 (18.4%) in the last decade from 69,543 in 2000 to 85,182 for 2010. Table 1
- * Hispanics represent 30.2% (25,734) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * The *most diverse city* in Volusia County compared to the other cities representing all races and ethnicities. Tables 3 & 5
- * Almost half 46.6% (25,734) of the Hispanic population in Volusia County 55,217 . Tables 3 & 5
- * Has the highest number and percentage of both American Indian/Alaska Natives (23.3%) and Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islanders (24%) in Volusia County. Table 3 & 5
- * City makes up 17.2% of the Volusia County Population. Table 5
- * The Hispanic population doubled in the last decade with an increased of 12,987 (50.5%) from 12,747 in 2000 to 25,734 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * City has a 11.3% (3,866) vacancy rate. Table 8

Edgewater

- * Population increased by 2,082 (10%) in the last decade from 18,668 in 2000 to 20,750 for 2010. Table 1
- * A city with a predominantly White 94.1% population. Table 4
- * City has a 11.5% (1,143) vacancy rate. Table 8

Holly Hill

- * Population decreased by -460 (-3.9%) in the last decade from 12,119 in 2000 to 11,659 for 2010. Table 1
- * Blacks represent 15.2% (1,771) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * One out of every five homes in the city are vacant 21.2% (1,465) county vacancy rate. Table 8

Lake Helen

- * Population decreased by -119 (-4.5%) in the last decade from 2,743 in 2000 to 2,624 for 2010. Table 1
- * Only city in the southwest region of the county with an decrease in population. Table 2
- * City has a 12% (154) vacancy rate. Table 8

New Smyrna Beach

- * Population increased by 2,416 (10.8%) in the last decade from 20,048 in 2000 to 22,464 for 2010. Table 1
- * A city with a predominantly White 90.8% population. Table 4
- * Almost two out of every five homes in the city are vacant (5,773), 34.3% county vacancy rate. Table 8

Oak Hill

- * Population increased by 414 (23.1%) in the last decade from 1,378 in 2000 to 1,792 for 2010. Table 1
- * Only 31 Hispanics live in the city representing 1.7% of the population. Table 3 & 4
- * One out of every five homes in the city are vacant 23.7% (247) county vacancy rate. Table 8

Orange City

- * Population increased by 3,995 (37.7%) in the last decade from 6,604 in 2000 to 10,599 for 2010. Table 1
- * Has the largest population percentage change (increase) in the southeast region of the county. Table 2
- * A city with a majority White 85.7% population and a growing Hispanic population at a current 16.9% . Table 4
- * The Hispanic population grew 81.1% in the last decade with an increase of 1,455 from 339 in 2000 to 1,794 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * City has a 17% (1,008) vacancy rate. Table 8

Ormond Beach

- * Population increased by 1,836 (4.8%) in the last decade from 36,301 in 2000 to 38,137 for 2010. Table 1
- * The only city in the northeast region of the county which did NOT experience a population decline. Table 2
- * A city with a predominantly White 92.2% population. Table 4
- * Ranks 4th in the county with the largest number 864 and percentage 11.4% of the Asian population. Table 5
- * The Hispanic population doubled in the last decade with an increase of 782 (49.5%) from 797 in 2000 to 1,579 for 2010. Tables 6 & 7
- * City has a 12.8% (2,514) vacancy rate. Table 8

Pierson

- * Population decreased by -860 (-49.5%) in the last decade from 2,596 in 2000 to 1,736 for 2010. Table 1
- * The smallest populated city in comparison to the other 15 cities in the county . Table 1
- * The only major city in the northwest region of the county. Table 2
- * Some other race represent 35% (607) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * Whites represent 57.5% (35,265) of the city population, soon to be the minority race. Tables 3 & 4
- * Hispanics represent 54.1% (940) of the city population. Tables 3 & 4
- * City has a 12% (154) vacancy rate. Table 8

Ponce Inlet

- * Population increased by 519 (17.1%) in the last decade from 2,513 in 2000 to 3,032 for 2010. Table 1
- * Only 4 Blacks live in the city representing .1% of the population. Table 3 & 4
- * A city with a predominantly White 97% population. Table 4
- * The Black population is the only group showing a population decrease in the last decade from 15 in 2000 to 4 in 2010. Table 7 & 8
- * Almost half, every other home in the city are vacant (1,381) 47.4% county vacancy rate. Table 8

Port Orange

- * Population increased by 10,225 (18.2%) in the last decade from 45,823 in 2000 to 56,048 for 2010. Table 1
- * Ranks 2nd in the county with the largest number 1,261 and percentage 16.7% of the Asian population. Table 5
- * A city with a predominantly White 91.3% population. Table 4
- * City has a 11.2% (3,131) vacancy rate. Table 8

South Daytona

- * Population decreased by -925 (-7.5%) in the last decade from 13,177 in 2000 to 12,252 for 2010. Table 1
- * A city with a majority White 84.3% population. Table 4
- * City has a 16.3% (1,074) vacancy rate. Table 8
