Shakespeare in Love (1999)

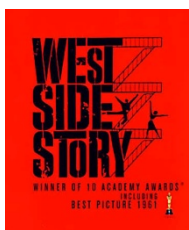

West Side Story (1961)

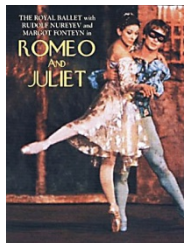
