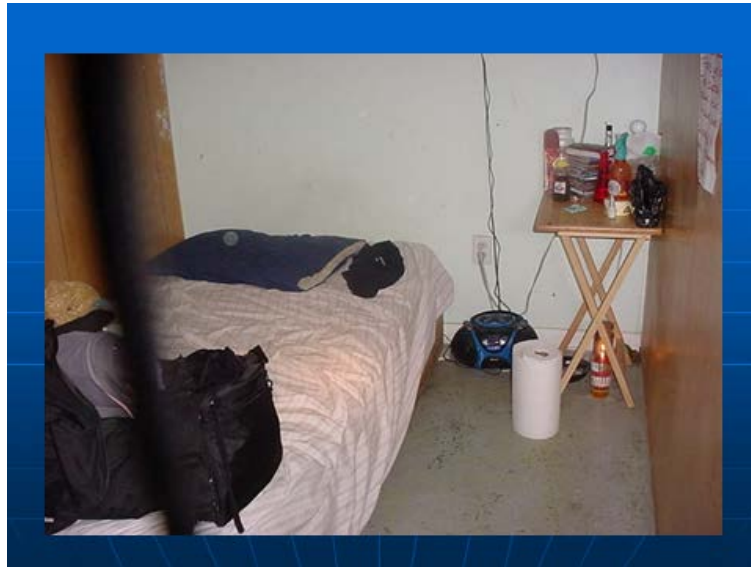

Human trafficking—modern slavery—is a flourishing criminal activity in Florida. As a state, Florida currently ranks third in the nation for forced labor and forced prostitution cases. Victims in Florida have included not only immigrants from all parts of the world but vulnerable U.S. citizens as well. Organized criminal syndicates are increasingly making human trafficking their crime of choice. Both federal and Florida law criminalize human trafficking, and now offer Florida law enforcement officers important new tools for combating modern slavery crimes.

This 8 hour training provides a general introduction to human trafficking as it is occurring throughout Florida and the United States. Topics covered in the training modules include:

- The international scope of human trafficking
- Why Florida has become “ground zero” for modern slavery cases
- Brief overview of federal and Florida laws on human trafficking
- Indicators of modern slave cases and criminal schemes
- Evolving best practices in investigating human trafficking cases and in interviewing trafficking victims
- Survey of human trafficking cases to date throughout Florida
- Introduction to collaborative work with victim service providers
- Resources available to law enforcement in combating human trafficking

Instructor:

Terry Coonan is the founding Executive Director of the FSU Center for the Advancement of Human Rights and a practicing human rights and immigration attorney. The FSU Human Rights Center offers pro bono legal representation to asylum-seekers, torture survivors, and victims of human trafficking. The Center currently provides victim care for sex trafficking and labor trafficking victims throughout Florida, and works closely with state and federal law enforcement officials in the investigation and prosecution of these cases.
