Keynote Speaker: Dr. Laurie Pendleton

Laurie Pendleton is the Executive Director of Faculty Success at the Association of College and University Educators where she has worked for the past 10 years.

She brings over 30 years of experience in education, including roles as a classroom teacher, school leader, and professional development specialist. For nearly two decades, Laurie has supported school improvement efforts across the US, UK, and the UAE, helping educators strengthen instructional practices and implement meaningful reform.

Her previous roles include serving as a Professional Development Associate with the Leadership and Learning Center and working with Leeds Global Partners to deliver teacher and leadership training in Abu Dhabi. She also held several positions within Edison Learning's Education Department, contributing to curriculum development, and providing teacher and leadership coaching and support.

Laurie earned her undergraduate degree from the University of Maine at Farmington, a Master's in Curriculum and Instruction from Capella University, and a Doctor of Education from Walden University.
