

## Daytona State College Procedure Manual

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## I. PURPOSE:

To establish definition for the prohibition of any action or situation which recklessly or intentionally endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student for the purpose of initiation or admission into or affiliation with any organization operating under the sanction of the College.

## II. PROCEDURE:

- A. Prohibitions regarding hazing may include, but not be limited to:
  - 1. Any brutality of a physical nature, i.e., whipping, beating, branding, forced calisthenics, exposure to the elements, forced consumption of any food, liquor, drug, or other substance, or any other forced physical activity which could adversely affect the physical health or safety of the individual.
  - 2. Any activity which would subject the individual to extreme mental stress, such as sleep deprivation, forced exclusion from social contact, forced conduct which could result in extreme embarrassment, or any other forced activity which would adversely affect the mental health or dignity of the individual.
  - 3. Any activity described in this procedure that would place students in conflict with the law or any of the College's code of conduct rules. These activities include but are not limited to forcing students to create disturbances, steal, vandalize, perform lewd acts, or perpetrate any other acts that would be considered illegal or a violation of the College code of conduct rules.
- B. This rule shall apply to acts conducted on or off campus whenever such acts are deemed to constitute hazing.

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- C. Any organization suspected of blatant disregard of the above hazing rule shall be investigated by the Office of Judicial Affairs, Campus Safety, and Student Life; and if found in violation, the organization's charter will be revoked and the organization will cease to operate on or off campus under the sanction of the College.
- D. Any individual(s) suspected of violating the above hazing rule shall be referred to the Office of Judicial Affairs for investigation and appropriate disciplinary action. Violations of the hazing rule may lead to suspension or permanent dismissal.

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
